

## **RANGE OFFICER DUTIES**

1. The Range Officer in charge has undisputed control of the Range.
2. Any Probationary member/Visitor must be entered in the Visitors book by a Range Officer.
3. Probationary members/Visitors arriving at the Club with a FAC and Firearms will have both checked by a Range Officer. The serial numbers on the Firearms must appear on the FAC. Any discrepancies will be reported to the Secretary.
4. Range Officers are responsible for the issue, safe use, and return of Club firearms used by non-members.
5. The Range Officer responsible for ammunition issued to non-members must ensure that non-FAC holders use all ammunition issued before leaving the Range.
6. Range Officers will check that Probationary members/Visitors hold a current "Permission to Shoot" form before the Probationary member/Visitor is allowed to Shoot.
7. The Range Officer will maximize the use of the Range by ensuring that where possible all firing positions are used.
8. Range Officers must be prepared to stay until 9.00pm.
9. The Range Officer is responsible for the implementation of Range Rules and total safe control on the Range.
10. The Range Officer can at any time "Stop Shooting" and expel any person from the Firing Point.
